ASPS Biennial Conference

We are pleased to announce the Third Biennial Convention of ASPS, to take place January 4-7, 2007 in Lahore, Pakistan with the cooperation of Punjab University through the Department of Sociology.

Disciplines from all the humanities and social sciences related to Persianate Societies will be represented.

Our first biennial convention took place in Dushanbe, Tajikistan, in September, 2002, with the cooperation of the Academy of Sciences of the Republic of Tajikistan, the Rudaki Institute of Language and Literature, and the National Commission of UNESCO, Tajikistan. This meeting brought together over 80 scholars from thirteen countries to present papers and to discuss a variety of themes on pre-Islamic and Islamic Persianate culture.

Our second biennial convention on Iranian Studies, "Society, History and Culture in the Persianate World," was held in Yerevan, Armenia in 2004, and brought together 90 scholars from eighteen countries. The conferences provide a rare and valued opportunity for scholars from West, Central and South Asia, Europe and North America to participate in an interdisciplinary dialogue.

Lahore is the cultural center of Pakistan and Jahangir's (d. 1627) capital. The city boasts some of the wonders of Islamic architecture, including Shahi Qa'leh (the Lahore Fort), Padeshahi Masjed, and the buildings of the Andarun-e Shahr (the Interior or Old, or Walled City). One hundred forty miles from Lahore is the prehistoric site of Harappa. Four hundred miles from Lahore is Mohenjodaro. Like ancient Mesopotamia and Egypt, Harappa and Mohenjodaro are considered to be cradles of civilization.

Travel to Lahore, Pakistan

Pakistan's national carrier Pakistan Airlines flies to many international destinations. Other major carriers, such as American Airlines, United, Lufthansa, British Airways, Air Canada, KLM etc., fly from North America to Europe and/or between European cities, where they make connections with Lahore flights.

Many flights to Lahore originate in London, UK or Frankfurt, Germany and connect in Dubai or Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates or Doha, Qatar. Of course, many other connections are possible. Smaller, regional airlines fly into Lahore mainly from other cities in the region.

There are flights from Iran to Pakistan, either directly with Mahan Air, or through Karachi, Pakistan with Iran Air.

We strongly suggest that you contact a travel agent in your area to assist you in your travel plans. They will help you minimize cost and travel time, especially connection times, as well as routing you through the most appropriate city based on your city of origin.

Note: It does not seem possible to book a flight to Lahore, Pakistan through an individual airline website, most likely because formal "alliances" do not exist with the smaller regional carriers.

Air Lines

Pakistan Airlines

Flights obtainable from major cities to Karachi or Islamabad (some direct), which would then connect to Lahore (Pakistan Airlines flies to 42 international destinations).

Emirates

Flies from London OR Frankfurt to Lahore, connecting in Dubai, UAE; also flies direct from New York, USA to Dubai.

Qatar Airways

Flies from Frankfurt OR London (LGW) to Lahore, and connects in Doha, Qatar.

Etihad Airways

Flies from Abu Dhabi, UAE to Lahore; and also flies direct from New York, USA to Abu Dhabi.

Mahan Air

Flies from Tehran, Iran directly to Lahore.

Kuwait Airways

Flies from Kuwait City to Lahore.

Gulf Air

Flies from Bahrain OR Muscat, Oman to Lahore; also flies from London to Bahrain and Oman.

Some airlines that fly into Dubai and connect with Emirates to Lahore are: Iran Air, Emirates, Royal Drunai, Lufthansa, Air France, and British Airways.

Some airlines that fly into Doha and connect with Qatar Airways to Lahore are Iran Air: Lufthansa, bmi, and British Airways.

Other options (this is not a complete list):

Iran Air flies to Karachi, Pakistan and then connects to a Lahore flight. Singapore Air flies to Lahore direct from Singapore, but may be an expensive option; Indian Air flies to Lahore from New Delhi, India; Thai Air flies to Lahore from Bangkok, but may be an expensive option; KLM flies to Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, and to Kuwait City, Kuwait.

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The establishment of the "Houshang Pourshariati Iranian Studies Book Award" was announced at the 39th Middle East Studies Association of North America (MESA) yearly meeting held in Washington D.C., November 19-22, 2005. The book award recognizes outstanding publishing in Iranian studies. The inaugural recipient of the award, recognized for lifetime achievements in Iranian Studies, was the late professor Shapur Shahbazi of Eastern Oregon University.

The annual "Houshang Pourshariati Iranian Studies Book Award," carries a stipend of \$2,000; it is awarded to nonfiction scholarly monographs based on original research published in English. Eligible for consideration are those that "seek to advance knowledge and scholarship on Iran and Iranian culture and history, and its expression in literature, philosophy, art, and science from ancient times to the present."

Please Note: The Travel Fellowship Program will only reimburse against **original receipts** for expenses including travel, lodging, meals, and conference registration. The limit is \$3,000. Those who receive travel fellowships agree to write a report of their travel and to submit a copy of the paper delivered.

The Central Asia Research Fund (CERF)

CERF provides grants of up to \$1500 to support the research and publications of individual Central Asian scholars in Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, and Northwest China.

We are pleased to announce a call for applications for the 2006-07 CERF award. Our deadlines have changed to enable us to better publicize the grant program in different regions, thereby making grant opportunities available to as many worthy applicants as possible.

The deadlines for the receipt of proposals are **September 15** and **June 15** of each year.

Awards will be announced on **November 15** and **August 15** of each year.

General Grant Provisions

Eligibility: CERF grants are available to individual applicants from Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, and Northwest China who demonstrate how their research will make a substantive contribution to the knowledge of historical, political, economic, or cultural developments in the region of Central Eurasia. Applicants must hold a minimum degree equivalent to a BA. Grantees are not eligible to reapply for a CERF Grant for five years from the receipt of a previous CERF award.

Financial Provisions: Grants do not exceed US \$1500 and provide funding for the following:

- Publication costs for books or monographs (including translations from English)
- Technical equipment necessary for specific research projects, such as computers, printers, scanners, voice recorders, or digital cameras
- Travel expenses for archival research that will result in a scholarly publication

Selection Process: CERF grants are awarded twice a year. Proposals must be received on each deadline of September 15th and June 15th. An ASPS evaluation committee consisting of the grant director, Dr. Jo-Ann Gross, and two persons currently serving on the Board of Directors of ASPS will review applications. The CERF Committee will make an effort whenever possible to provide regional balance in the distribution of grants based on:

- Importance of the topic
- Academic merit of the proposed project
- Demonstrated career commitment to the field
- Feasibility of the project
- Potential impact of the research
- Adequate academic and professional experience of the candidate

Application for a CERF award: CERF candidates are required to submit an electronic application in MS Word format that includes the following:

- 1. Name and address, email address, fax number
- 2. Place and date of birth
- 3. Citizenship
- 4. Institutional name and address
- 5. Research field or discipline
- 6. Highest degree obtained
- 7. Title and description of research proposal (1-2 pages) that includes objectives and potential impact of research and/or publication
- 8. Budget (included detailed account of specific expenses)

Award and Final Report: The grant period is for one year. Of the award, \$200 will be held until the receipt of a one page final report (sent electronically) within two months of the completion of the award, and the receipt of two copies of any publication resulting from the award. The report must include the following:

- Name of project and objectives
- Extent to which the objectives were met
- Impact of project
- Receipts of all expenses

In addition, a session entitled "75 years of History of Arabic Science in Barcelona: the Millás Legacy" is scheduled to commemorate the 75th year of the publication of J. M. Millás Vallicrosa's book "Assaig d'història de les idees físiques i matemàtiques a la Catalunya medieval" (Institut d'Estudis Catalans) and to honor this pioneer in the field of the History of Arabic Science in Barcelona and Spain.

The conference will be part of a program called "Barcelona Ciència 2007", sponsored by the City Council of Barcelona, which is devoting the year 2007 to the theme of "Science." Other support comes from the Societat Catalana d'Història de la Ciència i de la Tècnica, a filial of the Institut d'Estudis Catalans, which in 2007 commemorates its 100th anniversary (1907-2007); the International Union of the History and Philosophy of Science; the Spanish Ministerio de Educación y Ciencia; and the University of Barcelona.

We hope to be able to support scholars from developing countries with limited subventions to help cover travel costs. We will have more information on this possibility in early 2007.
